(c) if so, the extent to which mobile services in the rural areas have been successful; and

(d) the extent to which the company has been able to offer the services to rural and backward areas in the State?

As regard basic services operations, the number of fixed lines working in rural/backward areas as on 30.6.2002 are 10,37,366. About 80% of the villages are covered with Village Public Telephone Facility and about 96% of the populations is having access to Telecom facility.
