(d) if so, what is the estimate of the loss in terms of business and finance that could have generated by the Communication department due to Centre's decision?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (SHRIMATI SUMITRA MAHAJAN): (a) to (d) The STD/ISD service on PCO booths in 12 districts of Jammu and Kashmir and Internet service in Jammu and Kashmir State were suspended in the month of December, 2001/January, 2002 in view of security considerations. Government had been keeping a watch on the situation and a considered decision was taken in May, 2002 to restore these facilities keeping in view the totality of circumstances.

STD/ISD facility was withdrawn only from private PCOs working under franchise scheme. However, STD/ISD facility was available to customers on house/office telephones. There was hardly any loss to BSNL due to withdrawal of STD/ISD facility.

The Internet service are pre-paid account services. No separate bills are issued to users. The loss on this account cannot be quantified because the calls come in the category of local calls.
