(b) Price rise in the international market, decline in production of domestic oilseeds, increase in the tariff value of Palm Oil products etc. are some of the reasons for rise in the prices of edible oils.

Wastage of foodgrains during transportation

Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that lot of foodgrains is wasted while transferring it from farms to godowns or from godowns to rail or road dispatch centres;

(b) if so, the details of the quantity of foodgrains wasted during the last three years, year-wise; and

(c) the steps taken by Government to ensure the quantity of foodgrains wasted is minimized?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (SHRI U.V. KRISHNAM RAJU): (a) and (b) Some losses occur during transportation of foodgrains from farms to mandies/markets and from godowns to rail or road dispatch centres due to multiple handling, spillage, use of hooks by labour etc. An Expert Committee appointed by the Government reported in 1968 that the transportation losses in foodgrains from farms to markets/mandies was to the tune of 0.15%. The transit losses occurred in FCI during the last three years are given below:

Year	Transit losses in Lakh MTs	Loss %age of total foodgrains

(c) FCI has taken following steps to minimize transit losses;

- (i) Adoption of 50 Kg capacity bags in a phased manner to avoid use to hooks.
- (ii) Encouraging double line machine stitching of bags.
- (iii) Improvement in size and quality of gunnies.
- (iv) Squad inspection at selected rail heads transshipments and destination/dispatch centres.

Wheat export

(a) whether India exported wheat during 2001-2002 to various countries;
