THE MINISTER OF STATE INTHE MINISTRY OF SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT (SHRI SATYA BRATA MOOKHERJEE): (a) to (c) Due to globalisation and economic liberalization some employment opportunities in the older type of enterprises might have been reduced due to declining efficiency but at the same time fesh employment opportunities are being created in a number of new areas such as information technology, tourism, financial services etc.
