

(e) if so, the details of such flights?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI SHRIPAD YESSO NAIK): (a) and (b) On the basis of the techno-economic evaluation report of the Aircraft Evaluation Committee and the recommendations of the Board Sub-Committee, the Board of Directors of Indian Airlines in its meeting held on 27.3.2002 have approved a proposal for acquisition of 43 aircrafts *i.e.* 19 A-319, 4 A-320 and 20 A-321 aircrafts installed with CFM-56 engines at a net project cost of Rs. 10,089 crores. Fuel efficiency was one of the factors that were taken into consideration in making techno-economic evaluation. The Project Report submitted by Indian Airlines is under active consideration of the Government.

(c) to (e) Indian Airlines has no plans to introduce "no-frills and low tariff flights". However, in response to market requirements, Indian Airlines introduces promotional fares on its domestic network from time to time. The level of fare reduction varies from sector to sector and season to season depending on various market factors. The market factors include seasonality, strength of Indian Airlines versus competitors, supply demand equation etc.

Upgradation of airports in Tripura

2085. SHRI MATILAL SARKAR: Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that the NEC has decided to operate small aircrafts linking important towns of the North-Eastern region;

(b) if so, the number of services in the region and of these which will be undertaken in near future;

(c) what measures have been taken to upgrade the airports of Kamalpur, Kailasahar, Dharam Nagar and other airports in some sub-divisional towns of Tripura;

(d) whether there is a proposal to extend short services of aircrafts to link more important towns of Tripura; and

(e) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI SHRIPAD YESSO NAIK): (a) Yes, Sir. The proposal is in planning stage.

(b) to (e) Details of current air services operated by all scheduled operators including private scheduled operators in the North-East region are given in Statement (See below).

Indian Airlines is finalising a proposal to induct four 50 seater ATR 320 aircrafts on dry lease for improved air connectivity to/from and within North-East. As per the proposed plan of operations, the stations being considered to be air-linked by ATR-320 are:

ex Guwahati: Imphal, Agartala, Dimapur, Silchar and Lilabari

ex Kolkata: Agartala, Silchar, Guwahati, Dimapur, Imphal, Shillong and Aizwal.

At present Airports Authority of India has no plan to upgrade the airports of Kamalpur, Kailasahar, Dharam Nagar and other airports in some sub divisional towns of Tripura.
