THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI RAJIV PRATAP RUDY): (a) to (c) As per Annual Special 301 Report for 2002, released by the United States Trade Representative (USTR), India has been retained in the Priority Watch-list along with European Union and 12 other countries. The Report says that India's Patent system is far from complaint with its obligations under the TRIPS Agreement.

(d) and (e) India has undertaken appropriate initiative and has enacted/ amended legislation related to protection of Intellectual Property Rights to meet its obligation under the TRIPS Agreement.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI RAJIV PRATAP RUDY): (a) to (d) Yes Sir, Mr. Pierre Pettigrew, Chanadian Minister for International Trade accompanied by a large delegation of businessmen visited India in April 2002. No Agreements were signed between the two Governments but both the countries now have better appreciation of measures required to be taken for increasing bilateral trade.
