

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI TAPAN SIKDAR) (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Planning Commission has approved an outlay of Rs. 37995 crores for DoT (now BSNL) and Rs. 5446 crores for MTNL for the Ninth Five Year Plan (1997—2002) with a rider that the outlay is indicative and Annual Plan outlays would be fixed on the basis of actual and realistic availability of resources on year to year basis.

(c) Ninth Five Year Plan does not include state-wise expansion plans. However, the circle wise and not State-wise, expansions plans are drawn on year to year basis based on the outlays approved for annual plans by the Planning Commission and availability of material.
