SWAMI): (a) to (c) The Government has extended an invitation to all those who have strayed from the paths of togetherness to come forward for talks within the four corners of our Constitution. The United Liberation Front of Assam (ULFA) has not yet come forward for peace talks within the parameters indicated.

PM's meeting with opposition leaders on cross border Terrorism

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI CHENNAMANENI VIDYASAGAR RAO): (a) to (c) The Prime Minister has been regularly consulting with the leaders of various opposition parties on major national and international issues including cross-border terrorism. The Prime Minister's exchange of views and ideas with these leaders has been aimed at developing a broad national consensus on these issues.
