(b) how far the implementation of the two said schemes have progressed; and

(c) how much International Capital after deservation of the Garment Sector has flown into this sector?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TEXTILES (SHRI BASANGOUDA R. PATIL): (a) and (b) All State Governments/Union Territories have been requested to furnish project proposals in line with the guidelines of "Apparel Park for Exports Scheme" and "Textile Centre

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RAJYA SABHA

Infrastructure Development Scheme" for Central Assistance under these Scheme. The project approval Committee, constituted under the guidelines, has considered and approved two Apparel Park projects at Tronica City (Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh) and Surat (Gujarat) till date.

(a) whether Government have any proposal to start a capital subsidy scheme for powerloom units to help it upgrade its technology;

(b) if so, the main features of the scheme;

(c) to what extent it will provide benefit in the exports of fabrics and cotton silk and wool segments;

(d) whether Government is also considering to urge them to utilize the technology fund scheme which was modified in January, 2002; and

(e) if so, what extent this scheme has been fully implemented?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TEXTILES (SHRI BASANGOUDA R. PATIL): (a) to (c) There is no new capital subsidy scheme for powerloom units is under consideration.

(d) and (e) The Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme, which was started from April 1, 1999 is ongoing, and Government is taking all possible
