

A/C Rail Fare from New Delhi to Chennai

1160. DR. ABRAR AHMED: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the rail fare for two-tier air-conditioned sleeper coaches from New Delhi to Chennai is higher than IA air fare on the same route; as reported in the Hindustan Times dated 6th July, 2002;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) what steps Government propose to take to bring down the rail fare?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI BANDARU DATTATRAYA): (a) to (b) As reported by Hindustan Times dated 6th July, 2002, Indian Airlines and Jet Airways have offered lower air fare of Rs. 3,292 from New Delhi to Chennai for the period from 1st August to 31st October, 2002 as against the normal air fare of Rs. 8,960, provided the booking is done 21 days in advance. The rail fare for this sector by AC 2-Tier in Rajdhani Express is Rs. 3,415 and in Tamilnadu Express and G.T. Express is Rs. 2,279.

(c) There is no proposal to reduce the rail fares.
