

With the objective of bridging the gap between irrigation potential created and irrigation potential utilized, the Command Area Development Programme (CAD) was initiated in 1974 and subsequently restructured as Command Area Development and Water Management (CAD & WM) Programme during 2004. Due emphasis has been given on Participatory Irrigation Management (PIM) and capacity building to users under this programme.

Ministry of Water Resources has also taken up a study through Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Ahmedabad, IIM Banagalore, IIM Calcutta and HM Lucknow with a view to ascertain the reasons for the gap between the irrigation potential created and irrigation potential utilized and to identify the measures for reducing the gap.
