It derives its powers and jurisdiction from the Delhi Special Police Establishment Act, 1946.

The role and functioning of the CBI have come under detailed scrutiny of the Supreme Court in Writ Petition (Criminal) Nos. 340—343 / 1993, popularly known as the Vineet Narain Case.
