(b) if so, the details thereof and Government's reaction thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI JAYSINGRAO GAIKWAD PATIL): (a) and (b) As per the information received from State Government of Gujarat, a few chapters of Std. xth text books of Social Studies describe the post world war situation in Italy and Germany which is a historical fact. There is no attempt to glorify the ideologies of Fascism and Nazism.

(a) whether Dr. Ambedkar Birth Centenary Celebrations Committee, headed by the Prime Minister, had recommended for ensuring admission of students from SC/ST communities to the fullest extent of the quota of seats reserved for these communities in the year 1993;

(b) if so, the action taken thereon;

(c) the total year-wise, number of students admitted in different faculties/disciplines in all the Indian Institute of Management (IIMs) and Indian Institute of Technology (UTs) in all the level of courses during the last five years; and

(d) the number of students from SC/ST communities among them and their percentage as compared to the total seats?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI JAYSINGRAO GAIKWAD PATIL): (a) to (d) Dr. Ambedkar Birth Centenary Celebrations Committee has recommended admission of students from SC/ST community as per the quota reserved for them. IITs and IIMs, which are Central Technical Institutes, are governed by the reservation policy of the Government of India. In UTs/IIMs, relaxed cut off marks are maintained to draw up merit list for admissions of SC/ST candidates. Sufficient number of qualified candidates was however not available resulting in shortfall in filling up of the required quota. The percentage of actual admissions of SC/ST candidates vary widely in different institutes, course and in different years. To overcome the problem, IITs have started preparatory courses for admissions to Under Graduate level programmes for SC/ST candidates.
