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of total of 488 sanctioned ICDS Projects which cover the whole State of Madhya Pradesh, the Government of India and permitted operationalisation of 391 ICDS Projects upto 1999- 2000. Thus the total coverage is above 80%.

(b) The high Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) can be attributed to causes related to poor health and nutrition, teenage pregnancies, repeated child births, illiteracy, lack of access to safe drinking water and sanitation, poverty etc.

(c) 36 New ICDS Projects have been approved during 1999-2000. Approval of some more new projects will be considered during current and next financial year.

(b) to (e) Two Kendriya Vidyalayas were opened in Uttar Pradesh during the year 1997-98. No new Kendriya Vidyalaya has been opened thereafter due to budgetary constraints. There is no proposal to open Vidyalayas as of now.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI JAY SINGRAO GAIKWAD PATIL): (a) and (b) Government have set up National Literacy Mission on 5th May, 1988 under which the dominant strategy for imparting functional literacy to non-literates in the country was through Total Literacy Campaigns.

(c) An amount of Rs.956.47 crores had been spent from the Eighth Five Year Plan onwards upto 31.3.2000 under various schemes of Adult Education.

(d) Out of the 588 districts in the country, 536 have been covered under various Adult Education Programmes and an estimated 79.47 million nonliterates have been made functionally literate by March, 1999.
