

SHRI ANANTH KUMAR: Actually, this problem is being considered right from 1974. In 1974, the then Prime Minister of the country, Smt. Indira Gandhi, wrote a letter to the Cabinet Secretary saying that the Government should taken action to shift the Indian Army which is there in the Red Fort. The presence of the Indian Army in 75 per cent of the total area of the Red Fort is causing problems. Now, a Public Interest Litigation is pending before the Delhi High Court. The A.S.I. is going to file an affidavit, praying the court, joining the issue, that we also want the Indian Army to be evacuated from the Red Fort area for its better upkeep. I will be holding discussions with the Defence Minister in this regard.

Declaration of the new National Water Policy depends on its adoption by the National Water Resources Council.
