(b) The Government of India did not hire any ship, but has spent an amount of Rs. 25.00 lakhs for making various arrangements for the event.

(c) Advertisements were released in newspapers and a brochure was also brought out.

Development of Katchal Island

582. SHRI YADLAPATI VENKAT RAO: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

(a) whether Katchal Island was developed as Tourist destination to welcome the new millennium Sunrise;

(b) if so, the amount spent thereon;

(c) the earnings made from tourists; and

(d) the reasons for failure to attract substantial number of tourists?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND THE MINISTER OF CULTURE (SHRI ANANTH KUMAR): (a) to (d) Katchal Island is a restricted area and also is considered ecologically fragile. To get publicity advantage of the Millennium Sunrise, arrangements for regulated visitors for 6 days from 29.12.99 to 3.1.2000 were made. An amount of Rs. 25 lakhs has been spent on various logistical arrangements. It was a publicity initiative and because of the limitations explained, the question of earnings from tourists did not arise.

Development of Tourism in Assam

(a) the details of funds allocated and utilised by Government for development of tourism in Assam during the last three years;

(b) the details of the ongoing tourist projects in the State sponsored by Government; and

(c) by when the above projects are likely to be completed?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND THE MINISTER OF CULTURE (SHRI ANANTH KUMAR): (a) Central Financial assistance sanctioned/released during last three years to Assam is as under:—

(b) and (c) Six projects have been completed and 22 projects pertaining to tourist accommodation, wayside amenities, refurbishment of monuments, building of the Institute of Hotel Management, etc. are in various stages of completion by the State Government.

Impact of IA summer schedule on tourist arrival at Leh

(a) whether it is a fact that due to unavailability of seats and late declaration of Indian Airlines summer schedule to Leh has adverse impact on the foreign tourists visiting Ladakh every summer causing huge foreign exchange loss to the nation; and

(b) whether the Ministry of Tourism has taken up the matter with Civil Aviation Ministry in this regard and if so, the details thereof and the corrective measures taken?
