Use of Katta in Crime in Delhi

*59. SHRIMATI KAMLA SINHA: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Delhi Police is aware of the Katta, a locally made disposable gun which is suspected to be used in almost 80 percent of the violent crimes in the city; and

(b) if so, what steps have been taken by Government to locate the origin of the illegally manufactured weapon and what are the results achieved?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI L.K. ADVANI):

(a) Yes, Sir. Delhi Police is aware of the use country-made disposable guns in perpetuating violent crimes in the city. However, it was only in 9.41% of cases of violent crimes during the current year that said guns were used in Delhi.

(b) The interrogation of the persons arrested in connection with the use of such guns has not so far led to any concrete information about the origin of their manufacture.

Infiltration in Kashmir Valley

*60. SHRI SOLIPETA RAMACHANDRA REDDY: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether more than 2000 infiltrators have entered into Kashmir Valley;

(b) if so, the details of additional security measures proposed to combat militancy in that State; and

(c) whether Government proposed to hand over law and order in Kashmir to military alone, to tackle the ISI activities?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI L.K. ADVANI):

(a) There have been continued efforts on the part of Pak ISI and pro-Pak militant outfits to induct more mercenaries from across the
