- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI CH. VIDYASAGAR RAO): (a) It is true that Pak Army has increased cross border activities after the conflict in Kargil ended. Pak sponsored militant groups are also making concerted efforts to escalate violence in the aftermath of Kargil conflict by resorting to focussed tar getting of security forces.

- (b) Indian Army has beaten back all the attempts made by Pak Army to capture own forward posts in the last three months. The drive against militancy has also been stepped up in Jammu & Kashmir with the restructuring of the Counter Insurgency Grid in the State. Steps have also been taken to check trans-border activities on Indo-Pak border which include extensive patrolling of the border areas, erection of security fencing/flood lighting, relocation of Border Out Posts for effective domination and surveillance of the border, gearing up of intelligence machinery etc. Government have also projected the full extent of State sponsorship of terrorism by Pakistan to a number of friendly countries highlighting the dangers of International terrorism for the world as a whole.
  - (c) No; Sir.
  - (d) Does not arise.
- (e) All necessary steps to curb infiltration and cross border terrorism are being taken by the Government.
