It is proposed to cover the remaining Districts also under the Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme during the current Plan period where the State Govt, will provide the requisite facilities for opening of JNVs, as per Samiti's norms. The construction work in respect of 16 JNVs have been sanctioned and the construction work in respect of the remaining two JNVs at Goalpara and Nalbari is also expected to be sanctioned during the current Plan period.
