Adequate preventive measures are taken against such threats in a militancy infested areas by greater vigil, strengthening of the intelligence system and evolving new tactics to tackle such situations. However, a few incidents of this nature are not unexpected in such high militancy situations. Nevertheless, all incidents of this kind are thoroughly investigated and measures instituted in order to reduce such incidents to the minimum possible.

Civil Defence Infrastructure for tackling possible nuclear attack

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI I. D. SWAMI): (a) to (d) A model plan in connection with this matter was sent to the Government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi. According to them, the implementation of the plan is estimated to cost Rs. 400 crores approximately. The plan is under their consideration at present.

Bharat Ratna for Mataji Nirmala Devi

Killing of an old Man by Travel Agents in Delhi

- 822. SHRI E. BALANANDAN: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a newsitem appearing in the Hindustan Times, dated 16th November, 1999 about a sixty year old man being threashed to death by half a dozen travel agents in Cannaught Place;
 - (b) if so, Government reaction thereto; and
- (c) the steps taken by Government against travel agencies, which promise to send people out of the country, in return for huge amounts of money?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI CH. VIDYASAGAR RAO): (a) and (b) Yes Sir. The reported incident took place on 13th November, 1999 and a case was registered on the same day at Connaught Place Police Station in which two of the accused persons were arrested and placed in judicial custody. Non-bailable warrants against the other accused persons have also been obtained from the Court.

(c) As and when complaints of cognizable offences by travel agents/agencies are received, criminal cases are registered by the police and investigated to ensure that the guilty, if any, are brought to book.
