Fertilizer Projects in Himachal Pradesh

*193. SHRI ANIL SHARMA: Will the Minister of CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS be pleased to state:

(a) the details of fertilizer projects set up in the private/public sector, separately, alongwith their annual production/income, separately, in Himachal Pradesh;

(b) the details of private/public sector fertilizer projects proposed to be set up in Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and Haryana; and

(c) the details of such units in which foreign capital investment has been made and to what extent?

THE MINISTER OF CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI SURESH PRABHU): (a) There are no major fertilizer projects/plants in Himachal Pradesh.

(b) and (c) As per the industrial policy resolution dated 24th July 1991, no licence is normally required for setting up new fertiliser projects. Entrepreneurs are free to set up fertiliser projects anywhere in the country subject to environmental clearance. In the public sector, M/s National Fertilizers Ltd. (NFL) is at present expanding the capacity of its Nangal unit in Punjab by 1.48 lakh tonnes per annum of urea at an estimated cost of Rs. 135.13 crores. In the private sector, M/s Oswal Asia Fertilizers Ltd. have indicated that they are interested in setting up a fertiliser project at Sangrur in Punjab with an annual urea capacity of 7.68 lakh MT. As per information supplied by M/s Oswal Asia Fertilizers Ltd. to the Government, the present
