Exemptions to STs in UPSC

1776. SHRI PRAKANTA WARISA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have taken any concrete steps for exemption of MIL subjects in respect of ST (Hills) candidates of Assam in the UPSC examinations, as requested in written by the North Cachar Hills and Karbi Anlong Autonomous council; and

(b) if so, by when it is likely to be implemented?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI JAYSINGRAO GAIKWAD PATIL): (a) and (b) The Government of India has decided not to allow any exemption to the candidates hailing from Assam North Cachar Hills and Karbi Anlong. The Tribal districts of Assam from appearing in the compulsory Indian Language paper in the Civil Service Examination. A Candidate of the Civil Services Examination has to qualify in one of the Languages which find a place in the Eighth schedule of the Constitution of India. Since Assamese, which is the administrative language of Assam has been in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution since its inception and is widely spoken by majority of the people of Assam, the candidates hailing from Assam, have not been granted any exemption from appearing in the compulsory Indian language paper.
