1. Roman script (English) language (monthly and annual—Published up to 1993).

- 1. Assamese—Published up to 1970. UP to 1990 being forwarded to the press.
- 2. Bengali:—Published up to 1996. Upto 1998 being forwarded to the press.
- 3. Gujarati-Published up to 1962.
- 4. Hindi:—Published up to 1991. Up to 1997 being forwarded to the press.
- 5. Kannad: Published up to 1972. Up to 1999 volume under compilation.
- 6. Malayalam: Published up to 1995. Up to 1998 being forwarded to the press.
- 7. Marathi—Published up to 1970. Up to 1995 being forwarded to pres. Up to 1997 under compilation.
- 8. Oriya—Published up to 1980. Up: to 1992 manuscripts with Orissa Sahitya Akademi.
- (9. Punjabi—Published up to 1974.

- 10. Sanskrit—published up to 1977.
- 11. Tamil—Published up to 1991. Up to 1998 being forwarded to press.

- In the case of most of the language bibliographies there are one to two decades behind.
- (c) To over come the backlog, the publication of INB has been computerised and work for creation of INB data has been started. Software customisation is in the final stages. All Indian language Divisions are integrated through GIST terminals to enable instant translation. The manuscripts for printing backlog of volumes fo 1994 to 97 has already been assigned to Educational Consultants India Ltd., a Government of India enterprise.
