

Government is aware of the sinister designs of the ISI and has taken all necessary measures to curb its evil designs. It has been regularly sharing the inputs and sensitizing the concerned State Governments and agencies regarding the activities of ISI. In order to prevent infiltration, border fencing and flood lighting has been undertaken along stretches of the Indo-Pakistan and Indo-Bangladesh border, besides strengthening the border management in general, including deployment of Units of Para Military Forces and Army. (a) whether the Liberhan Commission enquiring into Ayodhya incidents of December 6, 1992, has since submitted its report; and

(b) if not, the reasons for the delay and the likely date of submission of Rs report?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI CH. VIDYASAGAR RAO): (a) The Liberhan Ayodhya Commission of Inquiry has not yet submitted its report.

(b) The proceedings of the Commission are in progress and the examination/cross-examination of witnesses is still continuing. As such no time-frame for submission of the Commission's report can be indicated by the Government at this stage.
