International Fleet Review

2151. SHRI ANANTA SETHI: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have a proposal to host International Fleet Review at the Mumbai anchorage; if so, by when and the details thereof;

(b) the number of countries likely to participate; and

(c) the preparations made therefor?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES): (a) to (c) International Fleet Review to be held at the Mumbai anchorage in mid February 2001 is being organised by the Indian Navy. It is expected that 20—25 countries will participate in the event.

Pirates in Custody of Coast Guards

2152. SHRI RAHASBIHARI BARIK: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether some pirates from Indonesia are in the custody of Indian Coast guards;

(b) if so, the number of such pirates arrested; and

(c) the action taken against them?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES): (a) There are no pirates in the custody of the Coast Guard.

(b) and (c) Fifteen persons who had pirated the ship "MV Alondra Rainbow" were apprehended in a joint operation by the Coast Guard and the Navy were handed over to the police for investigations.

Fall in Production in Ordnance Factories

2153. SHRI ABANI ROY: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether production in ordnance factories has been registering sharp fall for want of recruitments;

(b) whether private traders are assisting in making available the desired production line; and

(c) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE (SHRI HARIN PATHAK): (a) No, Sir. On the contrary there is an increase in Value of Issues over the last three years and the trend is expected to continue during the current year also.

(b) and (c) It is not possible to carry out all the activities in-house and out sourcing from private industry whether necessary is resorted to particularly for raw materials and semi-finished/finished components.

Casualties during Kargil Operation

2154. SHRI KARTAR SINGH DUGGAL: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) the total number of casualties during Kargil operation, officers and other ranks separately;

(b) the number of officers and other ranks seriously injured separately; and

(c) the proportion of officers killed and seriously injured as compared with earlier encounters of similar nature with Pakistan?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES): (a) The number of Armed Forces personnel killed during the Kargil conflict is as follows:

	Army	Air Force	Total
Officers	26	3	29
Other ranks	493	2	495

(b) The number seriously injured is as follows:

Officers	62	Nil	62
Other Ranks	1287	Nil	1287

(c) No meaningful comparison of the casualties of the Kargil conflict with those of the wars with Pakistan in 1947-48, 1965 and 1971 is possible, as the intensity, duration and the Armed Forces personnel deployed in these wars were different.
