(b) Declaration of any force as an Armed Forces of the Union is done in consideration of the factors like its role, duties to be assigned, manner of functioning etc.

Separate State for Chhatisgarh

- †2210. SHRI JHUMUK LAL BHENDIA: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the Prime Minister had assured the people of Chhatisgarh at a public meeting in Bhilai, to give final shape to the creation of separate Chhatisgarh State by bringing a Bill in the first session of Parliament;
 - (b) if so, the reasons for not any action in this regard;
 - (c) by when the Bill in this regard would be brought; and
 - (d) by when the status of separate State is likely to be accorded to Chhatisgarh?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI CH. VIDYASAGAR RAO): (a) The Prime Minister did refer in his public meetings to the early creation of a separate State of Chhatisgarh.

(c) to (d)The Madhya Pradesh Reorganisation Bill, 1998, which had been introduced in the Lok Sabha in December, 1998, lapsed with the dissolution of one 12th Lok Sabha. The procedure prescribed in article 8 of the Constitution of India is required to be followed afresh. The Bill providing for the creation of Chhatisgarh will be referred to one State Legislature shortly. Further necessary action will be taken on receipt of the State Legislature's view.

Modernisation of Madhya Pradesh Police

- (a) the resources being provided to Madhya Pradesh, the largest State of the country, for modernisation of Police force and the amount provided by the Central Government during the current financial year;

However, to supplement the efforts of the State Governments in this direction, financial assistance is provided by the Central Government under the Scheme for Modernisation of State Police Forces. During the current financial year, an amount of Rs. 118.91 lakhs has already been released to the State Government of Madhya Pradesh for this purpose and the release of further amount can be considered, if the State Government provides the utilisation details of the funds released for this purpose in the previous year.
