

(c) how much investment in billion would be required during the above period; and

(d) whether Government hope to connect every village in India by telephones by 2002 particularly in Rajasthan and Orissa?

**THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI RAM VILAS PASWAN):** (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The present demand for telephones is 26.17 million (22.88 million working DELs and 3.29 million Waiting List) and by 2005 and 2010 the likely demand is expected to be 82 million and 174.3 million respectively including cellular phone.

(c) The investment is likely to be Rs. 4512 billion (112.8 billion US\$) approx. upto 2010.

(d) Yes, Sir.

#### **Progress of Cross Country Highway Project**

**SHRI GAYA SINGH:**

Will the Minister of SURFACE TRANSPORT be pleased to state the progress so far made on the implementation of the ambitious cross-country highway project inaugurated by the Prime Minister at the beginning of the year 1999?

**THE MINISTER OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI RAJNATH SINGH):** 16 contracts have so far been awarded to for the upgradation of 220 kms. of national highways at an estimated cost of Rs. 670 crores.

#### **Deduction of Income Tax on Interest of Fixed Deposit**

**\*32. SHRI SATISHCHANDRA SITARAM PRADHAN:** Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the bank authorities are not deducting income tax on the interest of fixed deposit amount of larger sums as per the rule;

(b) if so, what action Government are going to take against the defaulting banks; and

(c) what action is proposed to recover the interest amount from the

depositors?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI V. DHANANJAYA KUMAR): (a) No, Sir. Banks are generally deducting income-tax on interest on fixed deposits as required by section 194A of I.T. Act.

(b) and (c) In view of (a) above, the question does not arise.

### Schemes to Prevent Misuse of Water

†\*33. SHRI BALWANT SINGH RAMCOOWALIA: Will the Minister of WATER RESOURCES be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that availability of water in the country has been declining during the last few years;

(b) if so, whether Government have formulated any scheme to prevent the misuse of water; and

(c) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF WATER RESOURCES (DR. C.P. THAKUR): (a) to (c) The average annual availability of water in the country remains more or less fixed on an average. However the per capita availability of water is decreasing due to increase in population. For efficient and judicious use of available water resources the various schemes like Command Area Development Programme, Water Resources Consolidation Projects, Participatory Irrigation Management, Conjunctive use of ground and surface water, promoting use of drip and sprinkler irrigation and promoting water conservation through Mass Awareness Programme have been taken up.
