Review of the Functioning of ICHR

2876. SHRI P. PRABHAKAR REDDY: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a three member investigating team has been appointed to review the functioning of the Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR);

(b) if so, the reasons therefor and the terms of reference of the investigating team; and

(c) whether the team since submitted its report; if not, by when is the report expected?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) and (b) The Government has appointed a Review Committee to review the work and progress of the Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR) vis-a-vis its objectives and work-plans and to report thereon. The terms of references of the Review Committee include (i) to review the qualitative and quantitative progress

in work made by the Council since its inception; (ii) to enquire into the working of ICHR and its regional centres; and (iii) to make recommendations and suggest remedial measures with regard to the future functioning of the Council.

(c) The Review Committee is expected to submit its report by August, 1999.

Resource Mobilisation for R and D

2877. SHRI KHAGEN DAS: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any plan of Government to encourage resource mobilisation through industrial houses/companies, for promotion of research and development, by utilising the talents available in different universities, national research laboratories/institutions, engineering institutions, colleges, etc., spread throughout the country;

(b) if so, what incentives are provided for Scientists and Engineers of different fields working in those universities, institutions and colleges; and
