(b) To supply 0.25 percent Sul phur diesel throughout the country Public Sector Refineries are imple menting diesel hydrosulphurization projects at various locations at a cost of about Rs. 5600 crores.

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI L. K. ADVANI): (a) to (d) The Government of India received 6,17,183 applications lor grant of Swatantrata Sainik Samman Pension out of which fjie Pension in respect of 1,64,135 sanctioned after due persons was verification and recommendations of the Governments and the remaining State applications were rejected. The Govera-~ient have received several review petitions. As on 11.12.1998, out of. 4,168 review petitions pending as on 30.11.1998, 1.731 have been disposed and 2,437 petitions are under consideration review Efforts are

being made to dispose of all these review petitions expeditiously.

There are, however, applications for grant of freedom fighters' pension in respect of Hyderabad Liberation Movement and regional movements of Kerala which have been referred to the concerned State Governmeents and their responses are awaited.

permanent defence structure on Indo-Pak border in Punjab

*246. SHRI KRISHNA KUMAR BIRLA: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to sttae:

(a) whether Government have informulated a plan to build permanent defence structures for manning the sensitive Indo-Pak border in Punjab;

(b) whether in the absence of such permanent defence structure, how many times defence forces of Pakistan tried to infiltrate into our. territory during the last one year; and

(c) the steps taken by Govenmenr to check any type of infiltration by Pakistanis into our territory?

THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES): (a) to (c) During peace time, Punjab portion of the Indo-Pak border is manned by the Border Security Force. This portion of the border has been almost completely fenced and bcrder observation posts and watch towers have been constructed for border management in peace time. For war, the army has constructed permanent defence structures the details of which cannot be divulged for security reasons.
