

(c) the when the construction and allotment of these flats is likely to be completed; and

(d) the action Government propose to take for the delay?

THE MINISTER OF URBAN AFFAIRS AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI RAM JETHMALANI): (a) and (b) DDA has reported that it has been stipulated in the brochure for 9th SFS, 1996, that where construction work is in progress in respect of flats which are being included in the Scheme it will take 1-2.5 years to complete the construction and compensation on account of delay, if any, will be payable for period beyond 2.5 years. 1498 flats in Dwarka and 530 flats in Shalimar Bagh were under construction and taken up for allocation in the draw held on 31.12.96 and published on 1.1.97, out of these, 1332 flats in Dwarka, where construction was completed, have already been allotted. The following flats, where construction is not complete, could not be allotted for the reasons mentioned below each of them:

(1) Sector-9, Pocket-1, Dwarka, No. of Flats : 115

During the execution of the work the test pile failed and had to be redesigned.

(2) Sector-19, Pocket-1, Dwarka, No. of Flats : 51

Keeping in view the slow progress of the work by the contractor, the work was rescinded and has been rearranged with the starting date as January, 1998.

(3) Sector-D, Pocket-A, Shalimar Bagh, No. of Flats : 530

Being a low lying area prone to floods, the site had to be re-claimed by earth filling. Certain encroachments in parts had also to be cleared.

(c) In respect of the three schemes mentioned above, the likely date of completion is mentioned below.

(d) The delay in two groups of flats of Shalimar Bagh i.e. in Group II and III, is due to the area being low lying and prone to flood and involved clearing of encroachments in parts. Therefore, no action appears to be warranted.

(c) UBSP programme which has subsumed into Swarna Jayanti Shahari Rozgar Yojana (SJSRY) w.e.f. 1.12.97 was a continuous process; a total number of 95 lakhs urban poor were benefitted by the programme, as reported by the States.
