Delay in Revival and Modernisation of Ailing IISCO

1313. SHRI GOVINDRAO ADIK: Will the Minister of STEEL be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the proposal for revival/Modenisation of ailing Indian Iron and Steel Co. (IISCO) has been inordinately delayed causing significant cost escalation;

(b) if so, the details regarding the extent of delay in taking the decision in the matter and justification therefor, and

(c) the present status of the modernisation proposal for Indian Iron and Steel Company (IISCO) and details of the broad features of the plan proposal finalised, economic implication and implementation Schedule?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI RAMESH BAIS): (a) to (c) Indian Iron & Steel Co. Ltd. (IISCO) was referred to BIFR in June 1994. Various schemes/proposals for revival and modernisation of IISCO were considered but could not be finalised due mainly to fund constraints. A proposal for modernisation of IISCO by utilisation of funds from the Steel Development Fund (SDF) is under consideration of the Government.

As IISCO has been referred to the BIFR, any scheme to be taken up for modernisation will have to be in accordance with the orders of the BIFR in this regard.
