

**Progress of Bhubaneswar-Cuttack Four Line Work**

1494. SHRI NARENDRA PRADHAN: Will the Minister of SURFACE TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the construction work of the Bhubaneswar-Cuttack four lane system is behind schedule; and

(b) if so, by when it is likely to be completed and the reasons for the delay?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (DR. DEBENDRA PRADHAN): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) it is likely to be completed by March, 2000.

The following factors have contributed to the delay:—

- (i) Initial problems of utility relocation and non-availability of site, free from encumbrances, on account of stay order of Court. These problems have since been solved.
- (ii) Demand of local people for construction of extra service roads, extra under passes and median cuts.
- (iii) Difficulty in obtaining embankment construction material.
- (iv) Stay order by High Court led to closure of quarries resulting in non-commissioning of the crusher plants.

**Financial Performance of CIWTC**

SHRI ASHOK MITRA:

Will the Minister of SURFACE TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

(a) the details of the annual profit and loss accounts of the Central Inland Water

Transport Corporation in each of the years since 1990-91;

(b) the factors inhibiting the progress of the organisation; and

(c) the proposals currently being examined to improve the operational efficiency of the CIWTC?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (DR. DEBENDRA PRADHAN): (a) Necessary details are given in Annexure [See appendix 184, Annexure So. 47]

(b) The main factors inhibiting the progress of the corporation are given below: (i) over staffing; (ii) high operational cost; (iii) low labour productivity; (iv) continuation of non core activities e.g. foundry & machine shop; (v) long turn-around time of the vessels; (vi) low operational efficiency; (vii) poor infrastructure support i.e. absence of high navigation facilities and terminal facilities outside Calcutta; (viii) multi union activities.

(c) M/s. A.F Ferguson & Co. were commissioned to work out a turnaround strategy for the CIWTC. The Consultants had submitted the report indicating various options for the revival of the corporation which is under consideration of the Government.
