1647. श्री मनोहर कान्त ध्यानी: क्या वस्त्र मंत्री यह बताने की कपा करेंगे कि :

- (क) क्या लखनऊ में एक "अप्रैल डिजाइनिंग" संस्थान की स्थापना हेत प्रस्ताव लंबित पडा है:
- (ख) क्या यह भी सच है कि उक्त प्रस्ताव के अंर्तगत फैशन डिजाइनिंग का तीन वर्षीय पाउ्यक्रम तथा परिधान निर्माण का दो वर्षीय पाठयक्रम आरंभ किया

1648. SHRI ASHOK MITRA: SHRI DIPANKAR **MUKHERJEE**

Will the Minister of TEXTILES be pleased to state:

- (a) the reasons for India's withdrawal from the World Jute Organisation;
- (b) the likely consequence of the withdrawal on the country's export of jute and jute products; and
- (c) the likely impact of the decision on raw jute prices and the level of employment in the jute industry?

THE MINISTER OF TEXTILES (SHRI KASHIRAM RANA): (a) India decided to withdraw from International Jute Organisation since no consensus could be reached amongst IJO members for election of India candidate for the post of Executive Director IIO, following pressure from the importing countries to get their candidate elected to the post. Moreover, it was felt that IJO has of late failed to live up to its main objectives and India as a major jute growing country stands to gain more from its own diversification and R&D Programme than from IJO.

(b) and (c) IJO is primarily a research and development organisation and the withdrawal of India from IJO is not likely to have any significant impact on either the export of jute goods or the prices of raw jute or the level of employment in the jute industry.

Foreign Exchange carned from Tourists

1649. SHRI PREM CHAND GUPTA: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that tourists arrivals during 1996 was 2.28 million showing a growth rate of 7.7% over last year and foreign exchange earning registered an increase of 21.6%; and
- (b) if so, the additional steps Government are taking to encourage this industry?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TOURISM OMAK APANG): (a) The international tourist arrivals in the country and the estimated foreign exchange earnings from tourism during the years 1995 and 1996 are as given below:-

Service Term of Former CMD, ITDC

- 1650. SHRI GAYA SINGH: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to
- (a) whether Government are aware of the news-item captioned "Two shortlisted for ITDC top post" appearing in Business Line, dated 23rd April, 1990;
- (b) if so, the reasons for not awarding another service term to former Chairman and M.D., ITDC whose performance appraisal was well appreciated by the Ministry;
- (c) whether Government are considering to appoint non-professionals and controversial officials of ITDC as named in the news report: and
- (d) if answer to part (c) above be in the negative the reasons therefor and justification for not extending the term of former CMD of ITDC, till date?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TOURISM (SHRI OMAK APANG): (a) to (d) Yes Sir. The matter of awarding another term to former Chairman and Managing Director, ITDC is under examination in accordance with law and directions of the Delhi High Court.

Buddhist Pilgrims from Asian Countries

1651. DR. MOHAN BABU: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether a plan has been drawn up to increase the flow of Buddhist pilgrims from other Asian countries; and
 - (b) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TOURISM (SHRI OMAK APANG): (a) and (b) The plan of marketing overseas Department of Tourism, Govt. of India, gives due emphasis to tapping of the Buddhist pilgrim market segment from Asian countries by way of advertising of the Buddhist circuits in electronic and print media, familiarisation fam tours, brochures support, direct mailing and "Know India" seminars.

Inadequate Funding for Buddhist site

1652. DR. MOHAN BABU: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Buddhist sites in Visakhapatnam are hit by inadequate funding for proper conservation;
- (b) if so, the reasons for neglecting the sites; and
- (c) the steps proposed to safeguard the sites for tourists especially from Japan, China, Indonesia & Sri Lanka?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TOURISM (SHRI OMAK APANG): (a) to (c) According to the information available from the State Government, there has not been any inadequacy of funds for the conservation of Kotturu and Sankaram. However, in the case of Bavikonda and Thotlakonda which are under the control of State Archaeology Department, the conservation/re-construction work was discontinued in 1994 due to paucity of funds. The State Government is taking steps to continue conservation and safeguard the sites for tourists.
