

**Seats for the Students of Kendriya Vidy-
alayas in MBBS/BDS Courses**

2703. SHRI RAGHAVJI: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether there are some earmarked seats for admission to MBBS/BDS courses for students of Kendriya Vidyalayas and/or Kendriya Vidyalayas of North-East region;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the criteria of selecting these candidates and agency through which it is made; and

(d) the names of those selected candidates under the provision since inception of such a reservation?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) No, Sir.

(b) and (d) Do not arise.

Pay Scales of University Teachers

2704. SHRI A. VIJAYA RAGHAVAN: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have finalised its decision to enhance the pay scales of university teachers;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether Government have increased the pay scales according to the University Grants Commissions (UGC) recommendations; and

(d) if not, the details regarding the advantages of Rastogi Commission Report vis-a-vis the University Grants Commission's recommendations?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) to (d) The Government had announced certain

pay structure for the Teachers of Universities and Colleges. However, the Government have received representations from the various teachers' associations against the announced pay-structure as also certain directions from the Delhi High Court for re-consideration. A final view on the matter is likely to be taken shortly.

Guru Nanak Chair

2705. SHRI KARTAR SINGH DUGGAL: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) the fate of Guru Nanak Chair Instituted by the UGC at Jadavpur University in 1969;

(b) whether it has been thrown open since 1980 and it is no longer confined to the Sikh Studies; and

(c) if so, whether there is any move to revive the Chair on the eve of the tricentenary celebration of the Khalsa in 1999?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) to (c) The information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House.

**Proposal to Publish Catalogue of Literary
and Historical Works**

2706. DR. C. NARAYANA REDDY: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is fact that a large number of literary and historical works including Mirza Ghalib's poems of the 19th century on William Bentinck, Sir Charles Metcalfe and Lord Auckland and Henry Parker's translations of works by Sadi, Meier and Hafiz of the 18th Century are lying unused in archival repositories; and

(b) if so, whether Government would consider publishing a catalogue of such rare works with brief explanatory note?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) Mirza Ghalib's poems on Charles Metcalfe and Lord Auckland are available in the National Archives of India. The National Archives of India does not have Henry Parker's translation of Sadi, Meer and Hafiz Extracts from the works of Sadi, Khushro and other eminent Literary personalities are, however, available with their translations.

All these literary material are open for consultation and use by scholars. In fact an exclusive exhibition on the works of Ghalib was inaugurated by Prof. V.K.R.V. Rao, the then Minister of Education on 24th February, 1969.

(c) The National Archives of India have already published catalogue of works of Fort William collection. The catalogue consist of about 200 very rare and important manuscripts. The National Archives of have also published a catalogue of acquired manuscripts obtained by way of donation or purchase through Historical Document Purchase Committee. The letters and poems of Ghalib, available in the National Archives of India from the year 1806 to 1861 are included in the series of Public Records and as such no separate catalogue has been published. Catalogue and indices on Public Records are, however, available in the National Archives of India.

Train between Calcutta and Bangladesh

(a) whether Government intend to introduce "a train between Calcutta and Bangladesh; and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI RAM NAIK): (a) No, Sir.

Licensed porters at Nagpur junction

2708. MISS SAROJ KHAPARDE: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) the total number of licensed porters operating at Nagpur junction in Maharashtra; and

(b) what welfare measures Government have introduced for these porters particularly for those who have become old?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI RAM NAIK): (a) 274 Licensed Porters are operating at Nagpur Junction in Maharashtra.

(c) The main facilities which are provided to the licensed porter include medical facilities for self, spouse & dependant children, issue of complementary pass once a year for self, admission of children to the railway school if the seat is available, issue of uniforms, resting facility at the station, etc. Besides, the facility of transfer of badge to the near relative of the porter is also available in case of old age, infirmity or illness incapacitating him for work.
