Recruitment in CPO

*412. SHRI KHAGEN DAS: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there exists a quota for recruitment in the Central Police Organisations, State-wise;

(b) if so, the details of quota and recruitment made in Tripura during the last five, years, year-wise; and

(c) what steps are being taken to ensure that recruitment upto the level of quota is made from Tripura?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI L.K. ADVANI): (a) There is no State-wise quota as such, however to maintain the All India character of the uniformed Central Police Organisations known as Central Para Military Forces, recruitment of Constables is made on the basis of population ratio of the State and also taking into consideration the special needs and circumstances of different areas.

(b) Representation of Tripura in Central Para Military Forces is adequate.

Encouraging Tourism in Goa

*413. DR. Y. LAKSHMI PRASAD: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

(a) whether the number of tourists visiting Goa has been increasing steadily;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) the steps taken to add more five star hotels in that State and attract more foreign tourists for earning foreign exchange?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND THE MINISTER OF TOURISM (SHRI MADAN LAL KHURANA): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) According to the information available from the State Government, the tourist arrivals in Goa has been increasing at an average rate of growth of about 5.3% per year during 1993 to 1997 from 969234 tourists to 1190598 tourists.

(c) The policy of the Government is to encourage private investment in the construction of hotels by providing incentives like income tax exemptions, concessional customs duty on imports, etc.
