create a demand for education and in many cases assist in or directly manage local level educational facilities like the MSK, NFE & ECCE centres

The MS programme in Baroda & Raj-.kot districts has trained village women in legal procedure and three Nari Adalats have been set up to address problems like domestic violence, marital problems etc. So far, the Nari Adalats in Baroda have handled about 200

The evaluation has appreciated the effective leadership role that women are playing at the village level and in the Panchayat bodies to which they have been elected. In Gujarat, 248 women from the Sanghas have been elected to various Panchayati Raj bodies.

(e) and (f) During the 9th Five Year Plan, it is proposed to expand the programme in additional four districts. During 1998, the programme has expanded to two new districts.

Mahila Samakhya is a process oriented programme which seeks to mobilise, organi.se and empower poor women. Human Resource Development.is critical achieving the programme's objectives. Since this is an intensive process, there are constraints in going to scale to cover the whole State.

- (a) The details are enclosed in statement (see below).
- (b) According to the information furnished by ICHR, the two main reasons for noncompletion of the projects in time are, (i) non-availability of some of the documents in India and (ii) the Editors of a series of ten volumes of a particular project working in honourary capacity.

(d) to (f) The Government of India had appointed a Review Committee in 1981-82 to look into the working of ICHR. The Review Committee's recommendations were sent to ICHR for com--pliance. While most of the recommendations have been accepted for remedial action by the Council, there are some recommendations which the Council has yet to comply with. Government have also taken note of certain recommendations which the Council finds it impractical to fulfil.

#### Statement

According to the information furnished by the ICHR, three major projects namely the "Towards Freedom", "Economic History of India" and "Dictionary of Social, Economic and Administrative terms in Indian Inscriptions" started between 1976 and 1992 are in different stages of completion. Besides, the Council also approved projects undertaken by individual scholars most of which have been completed.

Towards Freedom Project: The expenditure during the last 25 years on this project is Rs. 1,64,40,547/-. The first volume of 1358 pages covering the year
