view of the allocation during 2002 period after Simhadri Plant of NTPC is commissioned; and

(c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF POWER (SHRIMATI JAYAWANTI MEHTA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. Chief Minister, Andhra Pradesh requested the Union Government in November, 2000 for additional allocation of 200 MW to tide over the power crisis in the State and to review the allocation in 2002 after the Simhadri plant of NTPC is commissioned.

(c) Allocation to Andhra Pradesh out of unallocated quota was increased from 40% to 48% from 20th January, 2001. Further, a special allocation of 100 MW out of unallocated quota of Southern Region has also been made to Andhra Pradesh on first charge basis for a period of 15 days from 7th April, 2001 to meet the emergent power requirement of the agriculture sector and to tide over the critical power situation in the State.

(b) and (c) Finance Minister, in his speech while presenting the Union Budget for 2001-2002, has announced that a package of initiative is being launched by the Government to improve the power distribution system in rural areas. This includes: completion of electrification of bulk of the remaining villages in the next 6 years; extension of assistance to the States for village electrification works under the Prime Minister's Gramodaya Yojana (PMGY) whose funding is being augmented; stepping up credit support from Rural Electrification Corporation to SEBs for speedy electrification of dalit bastis, households of scheduled tribes and other weaker sections of society; improving the quality of power supply in villages; augmentation of distribution networks in rural areas supported by REC under the accelerated Power Development Programme (APDP); earmarking a sum of at least Rs. 750 crore out of RIDF for rural electrification works; and augementing the resources of REC by allowing it to float capital gains tax exemption bonds along with NABARD and NHAI under Section 54 EC of the Income Tax Act. The proposals for electrification of villages in Madhya Pradesh would also be covered under the above mentioned package of initiatives.
