Indian Institute of Travel and Tourism Management

4736. SHRI YERRA NARAYANASWAMY: Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have set up Indian Institute of Travel and Tourism Management;

(b) is so, the location and details thereof;

(c) whether it is a fact that there is potential for establishing a branch or campus in Andhra Pradesh;

(d) if so, whether any interaction has taken place with Andhra Pradesh Government; and

(e) the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND THE MINISTER OF TOURISM (SHRI MADAN LAL KHURANA): (a) and (b) The Ministry of Tourism, Government of India have set up two Institutes of Tourism and Travel Management:—

(i) Indian Institute of tourism and Travel Mangement, Gwalior (Madhya Pradesh).

(ii) Indian Institute of Tourism and Travel Management, Baji Rout Regional Centre for East India, Bhubaneshwr (Orissa)

Indian Institute of Tourism and Travel Management also has its Chapters at the following places;

(i) Kerala Institute of Tourism and Travel Studeies, Thruvanan'hapuram (Kerala).

(ii) Institute of Tourism Management. Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh).

(iii) Institute of Tourism and Travel Management, Delhi Chapter, Delhi.

(iv) Institute of Social Welfare and Business Management, Calcutta (West Bengal).

(v) Assam Institute of Management. Guwahati (Assam).

The Institutes have been set up to impart specialised training to students in tourism-related subjects to meet the growing needs of the Travel and Tourism Industry for trained manpower in the country.
