*236. SHRIMATI VEENA VERMA: SHRI SUSHILKUMAR SAMBHAJIRAO SHINDE:

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) what steps have been taken, so far, to ensure provision of 6 per cent of GDP for education, health and other social services by 2000 AD; and
- (b) what is the success achieved, so far, service-wise, indicating the details of Central and State allocations?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING AND PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION RATNAMALA (SHRIMATI DEHARESHWAR SAVANOOR): (a) Approach paper to the 9th Five Year (1997-2002) elaborates Plan Government's commitment to ensure provision of adequate resources for education, health and other social services. The Basic Minimum Services (BMS) programme envisages access of all seven BMS namely, universal primary education, provision of safe drinking water, health facilities, housing for all, to children. support nutritional connectivity to unconnected villages and streamlining the public distribution system with a focus on the poor.

(b) According to 1996-97 (Budget estimates), the plan outlay for social services for centre, states and UTs was Rs. 30490.77 crore against Rs. 23178.56 crore in 1995-96 (revised estimates). Out of this total amount of Rs. 30490.77 crore, a sum of Rs. 3132.97 crore is budgeted for general education, Rs. 814.30 crore for medical and public health, Rs. 1535.00 crore on family welfare and Rs. 1740.75 crore for housing. The Union Budget 1996-97 had a special provision of Rs. 2244 crores to provide Additional Central Assistance to States for these seven Basic Minimum Services. For the current year an amount of Rs. 2970 crore have been allocated as Additional Central Assistance for BMS to the States/UTs.
