international tenders issued to registered parties on IOC's mailing list. *Petroleum Products:*

Imports of major deficit petroleum products are made from National Oil Companies of oil producing countries halving exportable surplus on term basis. Efforts are always made to maximise supplies from these companies. Balance requirements are met through international competitive term/monthly tenders from the parties registered with IOC.
