and other war capabilities are indigenous and 70 per cent are imported; if not; what is the percentage of indigenous manufactured items *vis-a-vis* the imported:

(b) whether it is also a fact that the supplying Nations are forcing on us obsolete and outdated material;

(c) whether it is a fact that requirement of Air Force training Jet aircraft has been pending for long time despite major mishaps; if so; what is the reason for the delay; and

(d) whether it is a fact that out of total import; 70 per cent is procured from erstwhile Russian block countries; if so; the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE (SHRI N. V. N. SOMU): (a) 10-year national mission for enhancing self reliance in defence system was launched in 1995. At that time; it was estimated that 30 per cent of annual defence acquisitions were made from indigenous sources and 70 per cent were through imports.

(b) No; Sir.

(c) Commercial negotiations with the shortlisted vendors of Advanced Jet Trainer (AJT) aircraft are in progress. The acquisition of the AJT has been projected in the Ninth Plan.

(d) A majority of imported defence systems are of erstwhile Russian block origin. However, the exact percentage varies on year to year basis depending upon the specific requirements.

R & D Defence Budget

(a) what is the total percentage of defence budget for research and development;

(b) whether it is inclusive of development of missiles; and

(c) what is the allocation for other developments such as Automatic Rifles; ammunitions etc.?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE (SHRI N. V. N. SOMU): (a) The budget allocation for Defence Research & Development is 5.24 per cent of total Defence **budget** for the year 1997-98.

(b) Yes, Sir.

(c) The yearly budget allocation for specific Defence R & D projects is decided based upon the specific milestones planned to be achieved during the year. It is not in national security interest to disclose the yearly budget allocation for each of such R&D Projects.

Production of defence aircrafts

2364 SHRI RAHASBIHARI BARIK: Will the Minister of DEFENCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are taking any steps to increase the production of defence aircrafts;

(b) whether the aircrafts are being manufactured only by HAL or in collaboration with any foreign company; and

(c) if so, the target set for the production of aircrafts for the country's defence by 2000 A.D.?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE (SHRI N. V. N. SOMU): (a) and (b) Production capacities for various types of aircraft have been set up at M/s. Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL), to meet the futuristic requirements of our Armed Forces, para military forces and the likely civilian requirements.
