OBITUARY REFERENCE

MR. CHAIRMAN: Hon. Members, I refer with profound sorrow to the passing away of Prof. Saurin Bhattacharya, a former Member of this House on 25th April, 1997 at the age of 71.

Born in January, 1926 at Cooch-Bihar in West Bengal, Prof. Bhattacharya had his education at Jenkins School and at Vidyasagar College. Prof. Bhattacharya was ex-terred from Cooch-Bihar in 1942 for involvement in the Quit India Movement. He was imprisoned thrice for participation in Students' Movement, State Peoples' Movement and Peasants' Movement in Cooch-Bihar before its merger with West Bengal. In 1949, a *habeas corpus* petition, the first of its kind, against his detention was upheld by the then Cooch-Bihar High Court. Prof. Bhattacharya was closely associated with several social and educational institutions and had been active in the thick of All-India Teachers' Movement. He was a member of the Senate and the Syndicate of Calcutta University.

Prof. Saurin Bhattacharya represented the State of West Bengal in this House from April, 1978 to April, 1984 and again from April, 1988 to April, 1994.

In the passing away of Prof. Saurin Bhattacharya, the country has lost a veteran freedom-fighter and a distinguished parliamentarian.

We deeply mourn the passing away of Prof. Saurin Bhattacharya.

I request Members to rise in their places and observe silence as a mark of respect to the memory of the departed.
