Delay in Grant-in-Aid to NGOs working in the fields of welfare of physically and mentally Handicapped Persons

3167. DR. KARAN SINGH: Will the Minister of WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether grant-in-aid to nongovernment organisations working in the fields of physically and mentally handicapped persons are often unduly delayed so that they lapse with the end of the financial year;
- (b) if so, whether this does not defeat the very purpose of giving these grants and demoralise the teachers and other employees effected; and
- (c) if so, the remendial meaures Government intend to take to ensure that grants are released in time?

THE MINISTER OF WELFARE (SHRI BALWANTI SINGH RAMOOWALIA): (a) to (c) All efforts are made by the Programme division of this Ministry to release grant-in-aid to non-Governmental organisations working in the field of Handicapped Welfare in time.

Occasional delays do occur mainly for reason that the annual inspection report and recommendation of the concerned State Government is received late or the papers submitted by the Non-Governmental Organisations are not found complete.

All State Governments have again been advised to send their recommendations in respect of Non-Governmental Organisation's projects well in time. Non-Governmental Organisations have also been advised to send complete papers in proper manner so as to avoid making back references.
