THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI BENI PRASAD VERMA): (a) to (c) Already arrangement exists for the sale of postal stamps and stationery on agency basis through the Licenced Stamp Vendors and the Licenced Postal Agents. This is in addition to the sale of postal stamps and stationery through the post office counters.

1233. PROF. RAM KAPSE: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have initiated the retendering process for the procurement of telecommunication equipments for the entire country;

(b) whether the delay in retendering and actual procurement has resulted in the scarcity of telecommunication

equipments in various districts of the country, specifically in the Thane district of Maharashtra; and

(c) the steps taken by Government to ensure that the expension programme in the above district does not suffer due to inadequate supply of equipments?

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI BENI PRASAD VERMA): (a) No, Sir. Telecom Equipment is procured through open tender. Only in exceptional cases Retendering process is initiated, if the original tender is aborted due to any reason.

(b) and (c) There have been delays in actual supply of some of the equipment, strict monitoring is being done regarding supply of the equipment so that they could be made available for achievement of targets including those set for Thane district.
