*110. SHRI TARA CHARAN MAJUMDAR: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether seizure of several priceless antiques from officials of Nizam Private Estate have been reported;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether any action has been taken in the matter;

(d) if so, the details thereof; and if not, the reasons therefor;

(e) whether Government have drawn up some programme for the utilisation of these antique in public interest; and

(f) if so, the details thereof; and if not, the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DEPTT. OF EDUCATION AND DEPTT. OF CULTURE) (KUMARI SELJA): (a) to (d) On enquiry, the Government of Andhra Pradesh has informed that the local police has registered a criminal case under Sections 3, 5 and 14 read with Section 25 of the Antiquities and ART Treasure ACT, 1972 and Section 8 (a) and (b) of Prohibition Act, 1995 and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959. Five persons have been arrested in this connection. The investigation in the case is in progress.
