

(c) The export targets are fixed on a year to year basis. No specific export targets have been fixed for being achieved by the turn of the century. Government have been taking a number of steps to increase our textile exports which include encouraging exporters to participate in buyerseller meets, fairs and exhibitions; enabling import of capital goods at concessional duty for export production; special arrangement for duty free import of raw materials for export production; ensuring increased availability of export credit etc.
