Statement II

Eligibility conditions for the award of Jawaharlal Nehru Scholarships for Doctoral Studies

- (1) Candidates applying for scholarships should hold a first class post graduate degree in the relevant subject. Academic attaintments being equal, weightage will be given to the creative or innovative ability, overall personality, maturity, artistic talent and general awareness of current events.
- (2) Candidates should not be above 35 years of age on 1st October of the year of selection.
- (3) Scholarships to Indian students selected for doing field work in another Asian country will be available only to persons who have been ordinarily resident in India for atleast 5 years preceding 1st October of the year of selection.
- (4) Candidates wishing to study for doctorate degree will make arrangements themselves for admissioivtegistration in an institution and as such only those candidates, who submit proof of having obtained admissioiVregistration to the satisfaction of the Fund, will be considered for the award of scholarships.
- (5) The scholarships will be tenable for studies only in the institutions approved by the Government.
- (6) The scholarships to candidates of other Asian countries for study in India will be awarded to those who are already in India and, on completion of their postgraduate degrees, wish to pursue doctoral studies. However, if someone having obtained a Master's degree from an Asian country joins Ph.D. in India travelling to the place of study at his own cost, he/she will also be eligible for scholarship.
