Opening of Navodaya Vidyalayas in Orissa

*197. SHRI PRAVAT KUMAR SAMANTARAY: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) how many districts in Orissa do not have Navodaya Vidyalayas at present;

(b) whether Government propose to open new Navodaya Vidyalayas in some more districts; and

(c) if so, by what time the proposed Navodaya Vidyalayas will start imparting education?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA): (a) to (c) Navodaya Vidyalayas have been sanctioned in all the 13 districts of Orissa existing at the commencement of

the 8th Five Year Plan. A decision to open Vidyalayas in the newly created districts can be taken only on receipt of complete proposals from the State Government, including offer of 30 acres of land, temporary accommodation and other infrastructural facilities, and subject to availability of adequate resources.

Foodgrains Production

*198. SHRI B.K. HARIPRASAD: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) the quantum of foodgrain production in the country for 1994-95 and whether this is excessive and beyond our actual requirements;

(b) if so, whether India is exporting foodgrains;

(c) whether the projections for 1995-96, for foodgrains output, are being re-cast due to monsoons below normal;

(d) the basis of reckoning our foodgrains requirement for domestic consumption in terms of per capita in KG/year; and

(e) whether even with this per capita foodgrains availability, one third of our population remains underfed, living below the poverty line and whether Govt. propose to make any upward revision of per capita foodgrains consumption every year?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI BALRAM JAKHAR): (a) The foodgrain production in the country for 1994-95 is estimated to be 191.10 million tonnes which appears to be more than our annual requirements.

(b) Yes, Sir.

(c) The forecasts for foodgrain output for any particular year are revised at regular intervals keeping in view the changes in behaviour of monsoon and the weather conditions.

(d) The foodgrain requirement for domestic consumption in terms of per
