**Assistance to Assam under National Literacy Mission**

3107. SHRI PRAKANTA WARISA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) the details of financial assistance provided to Assam under the National Literacy Mission during each of the last five years, district-wise;

(b) the total number of persons literated in the State during that period;

(c) whether any target in this regard had been fixed during this period; and

(d) if so, the steps taken by Government to achieve that target in the State?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) A statement showing district wise release of funds by the National Literacy Mission to Assam for Total Literacy Campaign and Post Literacy Programme during the last five year is annexed. (See below)

(b) 18.40 lakhs persons have been made literate in the state of Assam since launching of National Literacy Mission.

(c) The National Literacy Mission has a target of attaining full literacy, i.e. a sustainable threshold literacy level of 75% by 2005.

(d) All the 23 districts in the State have been covered by Total Literacy Campaign. As per NSSO, 53rd Round Survey (1997) the literacy rate in Assam was 75%.
