Welfare Scheme for Punjab

(a) the details of the welfare schemes and programmes in the State of Punjab sponsored by Government;

(b) whether it is a fact that the schemes are financed by the Central Government;

(c) if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor; and

(d) what effective measures Government propose to take to protect the interests of female children through the aforesaid schemes and programmes?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WELFARE (SHRI K.V. THANGKA BALU): (a) to (c) A statement is enclosed (*see below*).

(d) The scheme of Girls Hostels for SCs is of special importance for female children. Similarly schemes for Post-Matric Scholarship, Pre-Matric Scholarship, Book Banks for SC/ST students, Upgradation of Merit of SC/ST students and Pre-examination Coaching Scheme afford equal opportunity to the female children. The inmates including female children are provided with food, shelter and also provided vocational training for their rehabilitation in institutions set up under the scheme for 'Prevention and Control of Juvenile Social Maladjustment for neglected and delinquent children'.
